Meeting decided:

1. Classes of Baltic Enduro

Clause 2.1 Classes, machines and participants of Baltic Championship

Include the following engine displacement requirements of the following classes, compared to 2022 regulations:

E1	Motorcycles with 100 cm ³ to 250 cm ³ 2-stroke, or 175 cm ³ to 250 cm ³ 4-stroke engines
E2	Motorcycles with 255 cm ³ to 450 cm ³ 4-stroke engines
E3	Motorcycles with 255 cm ³ to 500 cm ³ 2-stroke, or from 455 cm ³ 4-stroke engines
E 40+	Motorcycles with up to 500 cm ³ 2-stroke, or any displacement 4-stroke engines

Other championship class requirements remain unchanged.

Clause 2.2 Classes, machines and participants of Baltic Cup

Make the following changes to cup classes compared to 2022 regulations:

- Women class removed.
- Hobby class merged from Hobby 2T and Hobby 4T classes of 2022.
- Beginners (C) class merged from Beginners (C) 2T and Beginners (C) 4T classes of 2022.

Other cup class requirements remain unchanged.

Clauses 3.1, 12.1, 15.2 to be changed accordingly.

Approve the 2023 Baltic Enduro regulations with the above changes, based on 2022 Baltic regulations.

All voted PRO.

2. Awarding of Baltic prizes

Due to the low turnout of Estonian and Lithuanian riders on the Baltic award ceremony in Latvia on 3 December, propose not to organise awarding of Baltic prizes in 2023.

Lithuania will organise production of the Baltic prizes in 2023 and will send the prizes to EMF and LaMSF.

Organise the Baltic award ceremony in 2024 if there is demand from Estonian and Lithuanian riders.

3. Baltic and national championship competitions

Latvia, Madona, on 13-14 May – Baltic, Estonian, Lithuanian, Latvian championship and cup.

Lithuania, Kupiškis, on 23-24 September – Baltic, Estonian, Lithuanian championship and cup, Latvian championship (cup TBC).

Estonia - location and date will be established later - Baltic, Estonian championship and cup (Lithuanian TBC), Latvian championship (cup TBC).

All voted PRO.

4. Baltic overall ratings

EMF and LMSF each will pay 100 euro to LaMSF for collecting, clarifying, compiling and publishing the Baltic Enduro overall ratings in the 2023 season.

All voted PRO.

5. Baltic starting numbers

Starting numbers in the 2023 season will only be reserved for those riders who had annual licences in 2021 and 2022.

EMF and LMSF to send to LaMSF by 4 January 2023 the lists of those riders who had annual licences in 2021 and 2022.

All voted PRO.

6. Implementation of “power test”

Based on Clause 10.4 of Enduro regulations, each organiser is encouraged to implement the “power test” and adequately record the additional points in the competition scoring system.
